Guidance Notes

Booking the visit:

A school may phone the office or fill in an enquiry form to discuss dates for a school visit.

After receival of a booking form from the school, a date will be booked for your school visit. Booking forms can be found in this pack.

We strongly recommend that you visit Nothe Fort in advance of the trip to familiarise yourself with the site. Visits are free for members of staff who will be accompanying the group on the day. Normal admission charges apply for accompanying family members or guests. Contact the Fort **01305 766626** to book.

Prices:

£4.00 per pupil

Up to seven accompanying adults - free

Additional adults - £4.00

Payment:

An invoice for the visit will be sent to the group contact on the booking form.

Important information:

The Evacuee experience runs from 10am-2.15pm. If alterations are needed lets us know and we will do our best to accommodate these.

The maximum number of children - 45

The minimum number of children – 18

The day runs as a series of 30-minute sessions, the number of children in each group is decided according to our limited room sizes.

As such please see our requirement for adult supervision provided by the school:

18-24 children	3 groups requiring 3 adults
25-40 children	4 groups requiring 4 adults
41-45 children	5 groups requiring 5 adults

Additional adults can be accommodated if one to one supervision is required. It is advised that schools bring their own First Aider. There will be no charge for accompanying adults.



It will save time on the day of the visit if the children are split into the appropriate number of groups prior to the visit.

The Nothe Fort Gift shop stocks a range of pocket money items, souvenirs and books on the topic of evacuees. If time is required to visit the shop, please add this to the "Any Other Comments" box on the Booking Form.

Delays


On the day of your visit there is a delay, please telephone the Fort **01305 766626 ext 205** to notify us of your anticipated time of arrival.



Coaches

Join the A354 at Morrison's roundabout from the A354 Weymouth Relief road. Continue this road going straight over the junction by Asda and up Boot Hill into Rodwell Road. At the third set of traffic lights, turn left into Rodwell Avenue. Coach drop off at Newtons Road. Please note that 50-seater coaches cannot access Horsford Street and Barrack Road. Coaches can only park at Lodmoor Country park coach park.

On alighting from the coach head towards the footbridge that spans the road. Go under the bridge and take the path on the left. This leads you into Nothe Gardens. Follow the footpath until you come out of the trees and take the path across the grass to join Barrack Road. You will see the entrance to Nothe Fort in front of you. The walk takes about ten minutes. You will be met in the Gardens or at the entrance to the Fort if wet.

Days Schedule

On entering Nothe Fort you will be in time to 1940, this includes stricter discipline.

10.00am -Arrival - Evacuees party met in Nothe Gardens by Air Raid Patrol Warden (education team leader). The ARP warden will prepare the students to enter the Fort and will encourage them to sing wartime songs. Two children will be chosen to be "Sentries" and to check Identity Cards. On entry to the Fort there will be an opportunity for children to use the toilet. Groups will line up on the Parade Ground and teachers will be given coloured labels.

10.15am - Assemble in the Village Hall for welcome, housekeeping rules and timetable for the day. Introductory film with questions and meeting the rest of the team - shop keeper, schoolteacher, housewife and for larger groups a tour guide.

11.00am - First Session - Group breaks into the smaller groups for the rest of the day. Groups are sent off to their first session which will be either, Shop, Washing, School or Air Raid Shelter.

11.30am - Second Session - groups undertake second activity

12.00 noon - Third Session - groups undertake third activity

12.30pm - Lunch - please ensure the group brings packed lunches. For a more authentic experience ask students to pack in a paper bag and without using cling film of tin foil.

- 1.00pm Fourth Session groups undertake fourth activity
- 1.30pm Fifth Session groups undertake fifth activity
- 2.00pm Gather to round up the day
- 2.15pm Depart for the coach.




Recommendations

- Id card Please ensure each child has an ID card filled out. An example can be found in the resource section of this pack.
- Name tag Every child should have a luggage tag attached to them showing both their name and the name of the school. Boys should only have their surname, girls their first name.
- Period dress- this adds to the experience, everyone should carry a gas mask box instructions included in the resource section of this pack. As some of the activities take place outside please come prepared with warm clothing or sun protection as appropriate.
- Song sheets We ask that the children learn a couple of wartime songs before arrival so that they can sing whilst walking to the Fort and during a couple of the sessions.



Identity Card - Front/Back




